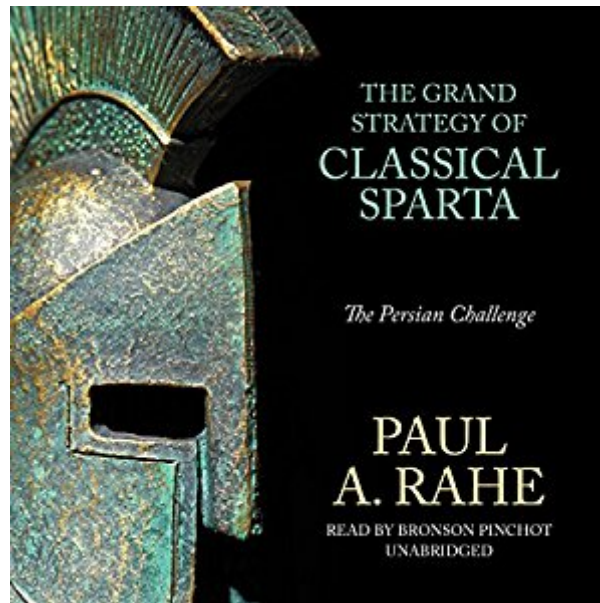

My other option was to give this brief book 3 stars to warn off general readers (which would have been fair to those readers who like their history well written but draw a line about, for want of a better word, background). Mr. Rahe is a real scholar who can write very well, and even write movingly. He wants to explain why and how moves were made by the Persians, the Spartans, and the Athenians. To do that, and do it honestly requires time because he has to deal with not with two, but three very different cultures. Without that long ramp up, which pop-military-history buffs apparently don't enjoy very much, readers can't begin to understand moves made by any of those

three cultures without knowing how the double kings came about. Nor can they understand how Themistocles in Athens maneuvered the political minefields as he did dealing with Sparta and other city-states, in order to build a fleet essentially from scratch, and also learned how to use a fleet on the fly. The Persian culture is respected and he gives the reader an understanding of how Darius and Xerxes operated, and probably how they felt about Greek cultures. So the military narration itself is comparatively brief. But it became exciting even to me who certainly knew the basics of what was going to happen before I began to read it. I recommend it to people who know very little about the Persian wars because Mr Rahe writes very clearly, with some humor and a taste for irony. He is a master of strategy, both military and political, and he is level-headed to boot.

Twenty-five-hundred years ago the full military might the Persian Empire marched upon the weak and disunited city-states of Greece. Despite the humiliation suffered by Persian arms at Marathon, only a decade before, the world was not holding its breath in anticipation of the result. That the Persian forces was irresistible was clear to all, and the outcome therefore was undoubted. In fact, when Greek spies were caught observing the Persian encampments, Xerxes, Persia's Great King, ordered them shown around his camps and sent back to Greece so as to spread word of the vast multitudes preparing to march. How the Greek city-states defeated and turned back the Persian menace remains one of the most incredible stories in the history of Western Civilization. Even today the battle narratives of Marathon, Thermopylae, Salamis, and Plataea are told and retold not just by historians, but remain staples of our popular culture. There are few teenagers who are unfamiliar with the refrain: "This is Sparta!" This is the story Professor Rahe undertakes to tell and he succeeds brilliantly. Rahe's work is, simply put, the most comprehensive and best written history of the Greco-Persian wars in at least a generation. Any historian writing about this period by necessity has to rely to a large extent upon Herodotus. But the father of history has since Plutarch renamed him also been known as the "father of lies." Rahe, a scholar deeply immersed in the period, also relies on Herodotus for the framework of his narrative, but he does so in a measured and judicious way. By employing the narratives of other ancient historians, playwrights, archeological findings, along with a large amount of common sense (often missing in historical analysis), Rahe unfolds a reconstruction of events that is certain to become the dominant interpretation of the period. As one can deduce from the book's title Rahe also does something attempted by few if any previous historians; he eschews the Athenian-centric view of the Greco-Persian Wars to more closely examine this set of conflicts from the Spartan point of view. As such, even readers who believe they have a thorough

knowledge of this great confrontation will benefit from Rahe's unique viewpoint. The Grand Strategy of Classical Sparta, is the first of three volumes on the subject. In total, and assuming the next two volumes reach the same impressive level of scholarship and storytelling as the first, we will soon have a corpus of work that will stand beside the greatest historians of the classical period.
