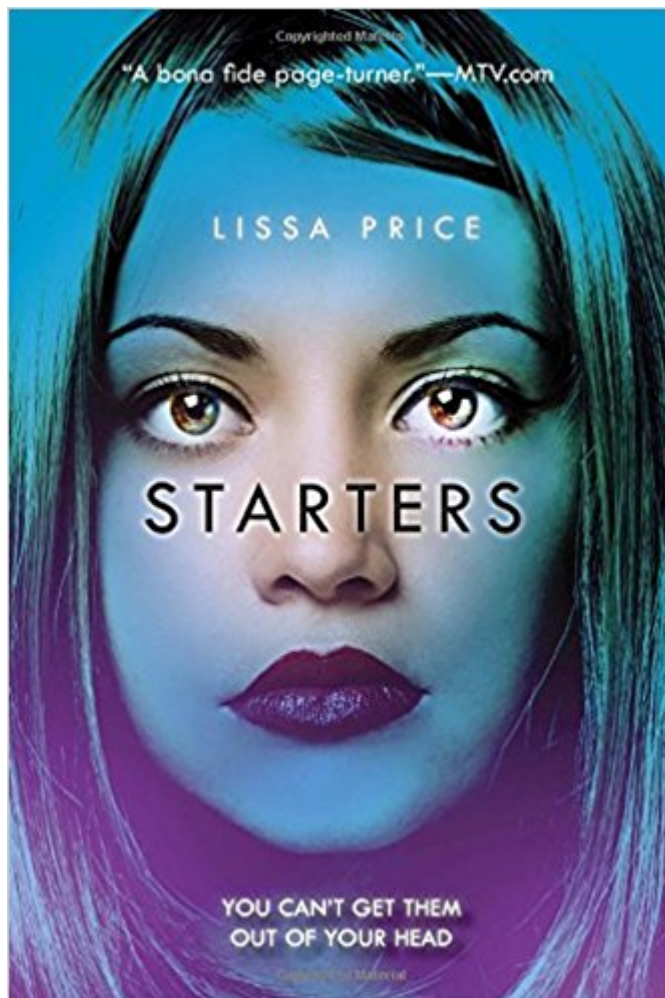

Gr 7 Up-Following the Spore Wars, 16-year-old Callie struggles to carve an existence for herself and her younger brother, Tyler, in a California where everyone between the ages of 20 and 60 has perished. Although many in this near-future society eke out meager, hopeless existences, an elderly, wealthy Beverly Hills population and their grandchildren continue their lavish lifestyles.

Medical advances ensure that entitled adults live beyond the century mark, creating a self-absorbed, controlling "Ender" class. Too young to work, Callie is a "Starter" on the run, in constant danger of arrest by the marshals and attack by renegades. Adding to her desperation is Tyler's rare lung disorder, making finding a stable home environment imperative. Unable to legally earn money, Callie registers with Prime Destinations, a clandestine service where Enders can re-experience youth by renting the bodies of teenage Starters via brain implants and computer interfaces. Although Callie's instincts scream danger, several rentals of her body proceed smoothly. But a malfunction during a third rental causes Callie to regain consciousness while being inhabited, immersing her in the lives of the rich and powerful, providing a love interest, and propelling her to the center of the sinister schemes unfolding at Prime Destinations. Lissa Price's intriguing, fast-paced tale (Delacorte, 2012) is enhanced by Rebecca Lowman's flawless voicing of each character and perfect timing. This is a fun dystopian YA book, following the trend of recent years. An evil organization with a mysterious leader. An unusual government situation. A strong heroine. There are many ideas that are becoming cliché, but they are done different enough in this book. The country contains only Starters, the young mostly under 18, and Enders, the elderly some of which are over 150. Callie is one of these unclaimed Starters. I liked the way these two social groups are portrayed. I was confused as to why the Enders of the future have the same interests as the elderly now. Why would they like cribbage and crochet? Wouldn't they have grown up with technology? I don't think it's ever specifically said what the year is, but that was one thing that irked me. Although the story seems simple enough, there are many things that turn out to be more complex. A lot is revealed in the last few chapters. The technology in this book reminds me of Joss Whedon's tv series Dollhouse. There are many similar issues dealt with as the end of that series, but this book has a younger audience. This is just a personal qualm, but I didn't like the way the author used the word geek. If you can't get enough of sci-fi dystopian YA, you should pick this one up as well. It is a fun, easy read. I give this book a 3/5. I'm excited to read the sequel.

I like young adult literature, and I love science fiction. Starters proves to be a fabulous specimen of both. Callie Woodland, the protagonist, struggles to survive in a war torn world that seems to like stepping on young Starters like herself. Robbed of her parents in the infamous spore wars Callie must take care not only of herself, but also her younger, sickly brother. This leads her to become desperate enough to take a job as a renter, allowing decrepit old Enders to temporarily transplant their minds into a younger, healthier body. Callie knows this is a bad idea, but poverty and a deep love for her brother forces her to go through with it. She is told it is safe, simple, painless, and best of all, lucrative, but nothing in this upside down world is as it seems. Callie finds herself caught up in a world of mystery, danger, and deception. What should she do? Who can she trust? The twists and turns of Starters will leave you on the edge of your seat, eager to see what happens next. The only thing you will know for certain as you read is that the protagonist, Callie Woodland, is a superbly dynamic, captivating character. She may start out as your average teenage girl, but is forged into a woman of quiet strength by the novel's end. Callie has me cheering her on and wanting more! What if you could rent your body -- basically go to sleep for a day or a week, while another person's consciousness "lived" inside of your body, skiing, skydiving, or skipping through fields -- for big, big bucks? No way, right? What a creepy thought...Well, what if your parents were dead and your little brother was sick... really, really sick, and the only way to save him was go on into Prime Destinations and rent yourself out to a stranger? That's the basic premise behind Lissa Price's fantastic YA thriller, STARTERS. In this excellently-drawn dystopia, there are only "starters" -- young people -- and "enders," very old people, some of whom have celebrated over two hundred birthdays. Why? When a recent war went biological, there was only enough serum to vaccinate the old and the young...The book jumps straight into the thick of things, the first scene taking us straight to the uber-creepy Prime Destinations, where the likeable main character, Callie, is understandably skeeeeeeeved, talking to the old "enders", who, in their power and hunger and basic chilliness, come off as something like vampires. The writing is great without drawing attention to itself, and the story rolls along smoothly -- despite its excellent plotting, amazing twists, and an ending you'll never see coming. STARTERS is a fantastic thrill ride sure to please both teens and adults, from readers who love action to readers who love mystery to readers who love mind-blowing creativity. This is a can't-miss read!
