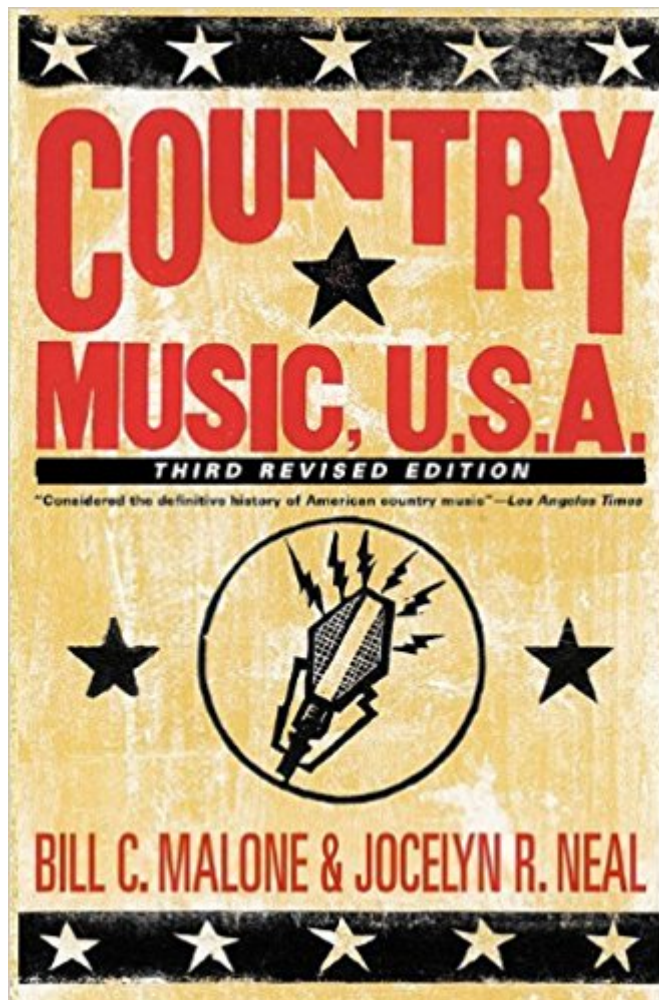

Synopsis

Since its first publication in 1968, Bill C. Malone's *Country Music, U.S.A.* has won universal acclaim as the definitive history of American country music. Starting with the music's folk roots in the rural South, it traces country music from the early days of radio through the first decade of the twenty-first century. This third revised edition includes an extensive new chapter in which new coauthor Jocelyn R. Neal tracks developments in country music in the post-9/11 world, exploring the relationship between the current scene and the traditions from which the music emerged.

Comprehensive

Bill Malone's major work is everything one thinks it could be - an historical treatise on the history of country music from pre-country to fairly modern-day country. Really recent singers in the past eight years or so won't be found here - but that's not why this book is a staple for the country music lover. It's not the kind of reading that invites a start-at-page-one-and-read-to-the-end attempt; rather it's an invitation to be choosy about a time period in country. Malone's views are broad and encompassing and even critical of others' writings about country music. One's favorite is probably in his work although Malone does not write in equal proportion to each performer or time period.

If you like country music, this book will entertain and inform you for hours. Well written and fun to read.

Country Music U.S.A. is a solid overview of the history of American folk music in the 20th century,

hitting most of the highlights without obscuring any of genres many blemishes. While the book avoids much of the mythologizing common to American folk, it never questions the music's core authenticity and distinctive voice in American culture. I would recommend for anyone's as a history lesson or as just a method for discovering the roots of many contemporary pop artists.

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
