I gave this book a 4 star rating because I liked it enough to want MORE, and was disappointed that the sequel was not out yet. There are a few developments that I was puzzled about, but not enough to interrupt the flow of the book overall. I think the story has a lot of potential. I got the feeling that the author wasn't sure what direction to go, but I am willing to go along for the ride, at least for now. I would recommend this to people who like paranormal fantasies with a different twist to Arthurian history thrown in.

We first meet Rhiannon as she is sitting with her mother's body in a hospital room and trying to come to terms with her mother's death. Shocking and even more disturbing events occur before the nurse returns. Things regain some normalcy, but then snap back to weird. The invisible teenager is noticed and soon finds herself neck deep in magic and magical thugs of one sort or another. Everyone has a side in an ongoing war, but will she pick a side? If so, whose side? The end of the book contains a teaser for the sequel. I hope it's as good as this one was.

Well this is not a novel of the same grade as American Gods while it tries to work out a storyline from a slightly similar concept (briefly: Gods are alive, all the myths and legends have some real background). What is a positive differentiator here is a quite elaborated story, the author did a good home work and successfully connected all small threads into a logical and interesting story. What I found a bit boring was a series of long descriptions about the main character clothing problems and general challenges in keeping her private room clean. Overall the book was easy to read even for a non-English reader which is not always the case.

I really enjoyed this book it had the right mix of mythology and action. At times Bound in Blue seemed a bit choppy, but it ended on a high. I will certainly be purchasing the sequel. The main characters have a good amount of personality, each character has their own unique form of magic. I liked how it almost had a X-Men vibe with the group coming together to fight for mankind. There was one really sad part that brought me to tears. I would recommend reading this book. It has the potential to be a really brilliant series, lets hope it only gets better.

This book exists in the world of the Arthurian legends, with a pretty interesting take on magical powers, especially the connection with colors. I personally love large casts of characters, but some of the twists and turns made this book confusing.
