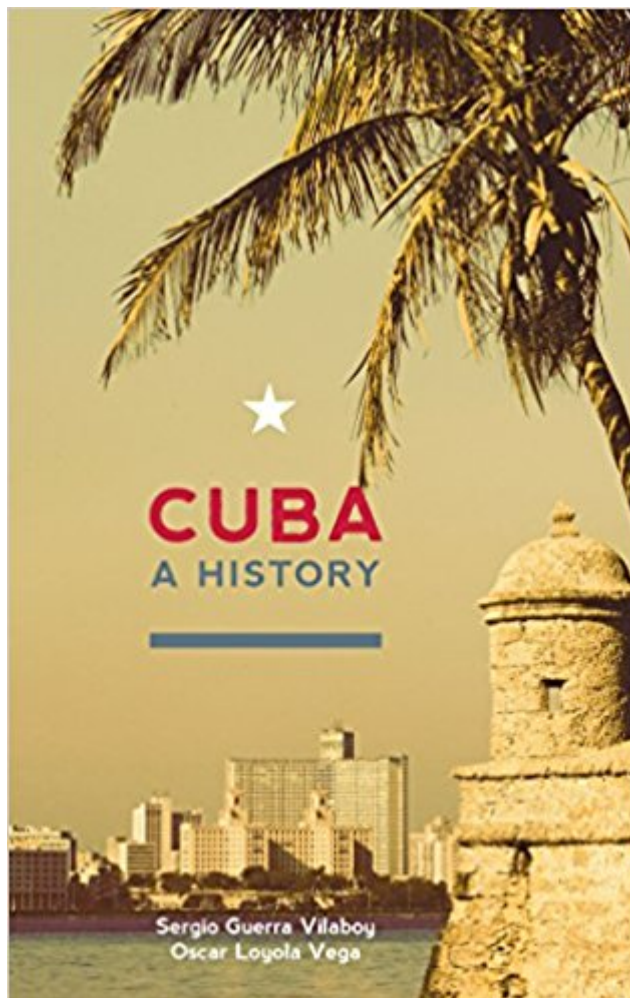


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Cuba: A History



Synopsis

Competitively priced, this book is the perfect companion to the more than thirty travel guides on Cuba available today. Beginning with the pre-Hispanic period, moving on to Cuba's struggle to maintain the revolution in the years following the collapse of the Soviet Union, and finally ending with Fidel Castro's decision to step down in 2008, this slim volume provides the reader with an overview of the history of the tiny Caribbean island that so often has been at the center of world politics. Including a bibliography for further reading, this is a most useful introduction to Cuba's history for students, teachers, and others, as well as those visiting the island. This book is published to coincide with the expected lifting of the US government's ban on its citizens' travel to Cuba and will be actively marketed through travel agencies, in-flight magazines, and more. Interesting and brief

The book is nice because it is short, but gives a very pro-Revolution narrative. If you want to get an objective view of Cuba and its Revolutionary history, I would look elsewhere. Since the author of this book teaches at the University of Havana, the content is in-line with the narrative the Castro regimes likes to paint: that the Cuban Revolution was an inevitable outcome and all of Cuban history points to it. If you want to understand the propaganda behind the Castro regime, this book will give you the Castro view of Cuban history, but otherwise, I would find a history with a more objective viewpoint.

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
